Marcus Chambers was a significant figure in Mid-Century British motor sports. In his youthful years, during the 1930s, he was a seasoned racing and rally driver who placed highly in the 1938 24 Hours of LeMans and he was respected as an ace mechanic specializing in performance Bentleys and the HRG racing cars. In the Post-War era, he was the director of the BMC (British Motor Corporation) racing program. He managed a stable of skilled and often professional racing and rally car drivers and was instrumental in promoting women drivers in rally contest in Europe—notably Pat Moss, sister of Sir Stirling Moss. His stature is such that Chambers is sometimes compared to the great Mercedes-Benz "works" team manager, Alfred Neubauer. Chambers was an erudite personality and curiously was a survivor of the tragic Halifax, Nova Scotia harbor explosion in 1917 in which over 2000 citizens perished. Marcus Chambers died in 2009 at the age of 98. This is a collection of his photographic images that he made during rally competitions in Great Britain and Europe primarily in the 1950s.

This is a collection of 270 35 mm color transparencies taken by Mr. Chambers at rally events. This collection was acquired with the Ludvigsen Library in February 2011. Mr. Chambers and Karl Ludvigsen were personal friends. Some of the Chambers slides have been separated into other Ludvigsen photo files and these are occasionally identified as Chambers images.

The collection is arranged into sleeve holders and stored in a manuscript box.
